Pupil Free Day


On Monday 1st December we are having our final pupil free day for the year. **Students are not required at school on that day.**

Parents & Friends



Starfish Nippers At Ocean Grove SLSC

Starfish nippers has been supportive of people with special needs for many years. The Starfish Nipper Program was started by volunteer lifesaver, Janet Jones at the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club. Moreover the Starfish Nipper Program aim is to provide a water safety and awareness program for children from the age of 6 and above. The program is designed to be inclusive to all abilities and needs in our community. The instances of The Starfish Nippers Program running around Australia generally consist of 5-15 people depending on a number of factors (safety is the key factor).caters for children and young adults aged between 6 and 25 years with special needs

Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club is proud to be offer this program for the first time this summer. The program is open to children between 7-13 years who are unable to access the regular surf ed program due to their additional support needs.

Activities for our Star Fish Nippers include: beach games, beach running, beach flags, water familiarisation and surf safety.

Sessions will run between 10am-11:30am on the following dates:

Saturday December 6th Sunday December 14th Sunday December 21st

Maximum number of participants will 8 to maintain a high standard of water safety and quality instruction and to ensure we have one trainer per participant.

Costs:

\$100 1 child, \$180 2 children
