If you are a new family to the school please come along to the meeting and see what it is about, and how you can be involved.


Sushi Wednesdays

CAR PARK REMINDER

The following rules apply to the car park:
No students are permitted in the car park at any time, unless accompanied by an adult.
Park as close to the marker in the centre of the parking area. There is plenty of room for 2 rows of cars to be parked in this area.



Parking is also available along the southern edge of the car park.

If the entire car park is full, as can happen on special days, you will need to park off the road along the drive-way.

In the mornings you may drop children off at the <u>Drop Off Zone</u>. Children should alight from the vehicle on the passenger side and enter the school grounds via the front gate. You must then move off to allow other cars access. Please note it is a <u>Drop Off Zone</u> only.

At pick up time, all parents must park in the allocated areas and collect their children from either of the gates. No parking is permitted in the drop off zone.
