## Stopwork Action

The Department is currently involved in enterprise bargaining with the Australian Education Union in relation to its log of claims covering employees in the executive class, the principal class, the teacher class and the paraprofessional class. As part of its industrial campaign the Union has called on its members to stop work for 24 hours on **7 June** 2012.

Under the Fair Work Act 2009 a protected action ballot of members of the Union is required before industrial action can be taken. The ballot was conducted by the Australian Electoral Commission and closed on 30 May 2012. The Commission has advised that a majority of members has supported the taking of industrial action.

Staff have until 12:00pm Tuesday to notify me of their intention to stopwork. A note will be sent home on Tuesday 5th June outlining the classes affected. If your child is absent on the Tuesday please phone the school and the appropriate information will be given to you.
