#### Father Of The Year. - Bethany Family Support

Now in its 13<sup>th</sup> year, the Geelong Father Of The Year Award is unique in Australia, in that the child nominates their father or father figure and entries are judged on set criteria which includes but is not limited to;

- \* Evidence of positive relationship with the child
- \* Specific qualities that are valued in the father/father figure kind of person he is
- \* Positive role modeling and responsible parenting

Children are invited to submit in 150 words or less why they think their father, or father figure, deserves to be Geelong's Father of The Year in 2012.

All primary schools across the Geelong region are being encouraged to actively engage their students in thinking about their father or father figure. The Award age categories are broken down as follows; 0-6, 7-10 & 11+. Every student who enters the Award receives their entry back along with a certificate to take home in time for Father's Day on Sunday 2 September.

#### **Drysdale RSL**

On Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August grades 5 and 6 students will have the opportunity to participate in an activity that commemorates the end of WWII in the Pacific.
